WELCOME TO THE 2ND ANNUAL COASTLINE CHILDREN'S FILM FESTIVAL

Seeing a movie can be like a visit to a wonder-filled land we may never come across in our everyday lives. The best films provide a place where we are all invited, no borders, no visas required, and no possibility of being excluded or exiled. The Coastline Children's Film Festival, now in its second year, is expected to entertain over 1000 children. This year's films, shown world-wide, speak positively to children and families of all ages, backgrounds and ethnicities. Selections include a 10,000 pound love story, a Cannes Film Festival winner from 1953 and a charming animated film about the magic of learning to read. Admission is free at all venues with a suggested donation of just \$1 per person.

The mission of the Coastline Children's Film Festival is to bring quality independent films and animation for children and young adults to Berrien County and present them on the big screen as shared theatrical experiences for families and the community. CCFF's anchor event is an annual festival presented at locations throughout Berrien County (full list on the opposite page) during the first two weeks in February. Occasional screenings of films fill the days between the core festival. Recognizing that film and animation are still among the most accessible and innovative media for the communication of stories and ideas, the CCFF sees the provision of educational opportunities as central to its mission and is pleased to offer a number of workshops and activities. In cooperation with screening partner Anna Russo Sieber Gallery in Benton Harbor, festival goers have the opportunity to learn the history and craft of filmmaking. Additional hands-on art experiences will also be available at the Krasl Art Center in St. Joseph. A complete list of activities, fees and registration information can be found on page 15 of this booklet.

Through its partnership with Brookview School-an independent Montessori school serving children from infancy to 8th grade in Benton Harbor, Coastline Children's Film Festival is thrilled to offer this first-of-its-kind program in Berrien County.

François Truffaut's first feature was this 1959 portrait of Antoine Doinel, a boy who turns to petty crime in the face of neglect at home and hard times at a reform school. Somewhat autobiographical for its director, the film helped usher in the heady spirit of the French New Wave and introduced the Doinel character, who became a fixture in Truffaut's movies over the years. Poignant, exhilarating, and fun (there's a parade of cameo appearances from some of the essential icons and directors from the movement), this film is an important classic.

Flawed is a charming little film about very big ideas. Artist Andrea Dorfman has the uncanny ability to transform the intensely personal into the wisely universal. She deftly traces her encounter with a potential romantic partner-questioning her attraction and the uneasy possibility of love. But, ultimately, *Flawed* is less about whether girl can get along with boy than whether girl can accept herself, imperfections and all. This film is an exquisite tribute to the art of animation and a loving homage to storyboarding-a time honoured way of rendering scenes while pointing the way to the dramatic arc of the tale.

This brilliant little gem, filmed and edited by Robert Downey Sr.-the famed underground director of the 60's independent classic **Putney Swope**is a silent montage of classroom activites with voiceover commentary by Cullum and three six-year-olds from his class.




Paddle to the Sea

In 1974, French aerialist Philippe Petit threw a tightrope between the two towers of the World Trade Center and spent an hour walking, dancing and performing high-wire tricks a quarter mile up in the sky. This short film captures the poetry and magic of the event with a visual charm of its own: lyrical words and animation that present the detail and daring of the vertiginous drama of Petit's feat.

Inside a warehouse artists build an enormous, precarious structure 100 ft. long made out of common household items—tea kettles, tires, old shoes, balloons, wooden ramps. Then with fire, water, gravity and chemistry, they create a spectacular chain reaction, self-destructing performance of physical interactions, chemical reactions, and precisely crafted chaos worthy of Rube Goldberg or Alfred Hitchcock.



Sixteen years have passed since circus producer David Balding adopted Flora, the orphaned baby African elephant he lovingly raised as part of his family and made the star of his show. As she approaches adulthood, David realizes that Flora needs other elephants, but the road to retirement is a difficult and emotional journey. Ten years in the making, the film explores the consequences of keeping wild animals in captivity, while never losing sight of the delicate love story at its heart.

The two friends formulate sophisticated and compassionate opinions on the state of their society, and by doing so inspire hope and active engagement in others.


